2. Tape that is used to hold down floral foam to a container _____
3. Form of glue used in a glue gun. _____
4. Container made of paper that is used to make a fresh flower arrangement _____
5. A chemical mixture of sugar, biocide, and citric acid. Add to water to extend the life of cut flowers. _____
6. A three legged stand constructed of heavy wire or wood used to support and display wreaths, other set pieces, and floral sprays, generally at funeral services. _____
7. Coated wire used to support fresh flower stems, replace stems, bind materials, etc. _____
8. A thin, plastic-type material ribbon often used to tie balloons. _____
9. A tufted, velvety, wired stem, generally sold in 12 inch pieces; available in a variety of colors and thicknesses; may be shaped and used as an accessory in designs. Also called a "pipe cleaner".

10. Sharp scissors only to be used for ribbon or fabric (never used on tape or paper) _____
11. A needlepoint holder used in large bowls. Also commonly called "frogs" _____
12. Tool with spring action handle and short blades that can easily cut any thickness of florist wire, corsage stems, and other heavy material. _____
13. Dense material used to create hearts or wreaths for sympathy work _____
14. Covering to hide mechanics on a corsage or boutonniere _____
15. Clear plastic liner used inside pots or containers to hold oasis or water. _____
16. Cellophane bag or bog to store and transport finished corsage or boutonnieres in. _____
17. Moss that is gray in color and is used to cover Styrofoam or hide mechanics _____
18. Small shaft pin used to hold one flower _____
19. For use with fresh flowers (or dried/silk), especially in a corsage; fast drying, waterproof liquid cold adhesive that bonds quickly and easily. Bonds to wet or dry material. _____
20. Absorbent material used to extend the life of flowers _____

21. A container made to fit the curvature of a casket lid to hold the foundation of the casket spray design. _____
22. Hand pruners with two blades which pass each other to cut stems or branches. One blade is usually curved. _____
23. Often used for cutting or trimming thicker flower and foliage stems. The cutting action goes in both directions without pinching the stem. _____
24. A knife specifically made to cut Oasis floral foam. _____
25. Tag used to give instructions on how to care for an item. _____
